## FREE Recycling Tips and Bins

Nonprofits, schools and home-based businesses looking to start up or restart their recycling programs are encouraged to contact the City's Environmental Services Division.

Division staff is offering suggestions on how to establish and run a successful recycling program and, while supplies last, will also supply a free set of bins to qualifying individuals. Bins are available in three capacities - 7, 23 and 50-gallons.



*The convenient placement of recycle bins near trash cans is a simple yet effective way to develop or strengthen recycling habits.*

To qualify, individuals must represent a Diamond Bar nonprofit or school, or operate a business from their home, and they must submit an application that includes providing details on how the bins will be used and who will administer the recycling program.

# Grand Avenue Beautification

## Plans for Streetscape Enhancements to Grand Avenue are on Track to Go from Concept to Construction this Spring

Focused at the intersections of Diamond Bar Boulevard and Longview Drive, the Grand Avenue Beautification Project aims to create a more attractive, defined and welcoming atmosphere by incorporating thematic streetscape elements into the area's crosswalks, parkways, medians and entry points.

These elements include decorative traffic signals, interlocking pavers, timber rails and steel panels, pedestrian and accent lighting, landscaping, and a new entry monument at Longview Drive.

The material and color palette as well as thematic patterns used in this project will form part of the City's Streetscape Beautification Guidelines to ensure that future beautification


efforts at other key commercial sections and entry points contribute to a consistent, cohesive citywide identity program.

Construction of the \$1.5 million project will be financed with federal SAFETEA-LU funds amounting to \$699,000, local Surface Transportation Program funds totaling

\$333,964, as well as funding from Prop C, TDA, and Prop A Exchange funds.

It is anticipated that the beautification efforts will be completed in late summer 2015.

# Sidewalk Replacement Project

An improved walking environment is the result of the City's latest sidewalk installation project. Completed last month, this project reconstructed six curb ramps, 248 linear feet of curb and gutter, and nearly 13,000 square feet of sidewalk in the area bounded by Grand Avenue to the north, Gateway Corporate Center to the west, Diamond Bar Boulevard to the east and Pathfinder Road to the south. All work was performed to the current standards of the American with Disabilities Act and financed with Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds.

# Utility Upgrade Projects

This month will see the completion of two major utility upgrade projects aimed at improving service delivery reliability.

The projects include:

- Southern California Gas Company replacing an existing 3" gas main with a 4" line to accommodate the South Coast Air Quality Management District's compressed natural gas operations.
- Southern California Edison installing new electrical circuits in the vicinity of Grand Avenue and Quail Summit along Diamond Bar Boulevard, and replacing a deteriorated vault at the southwest corner of the Diamond Bar Boulevard and Grand Avenue intersection.

# Vons to Become Haggen

A rebranding is in store for Vons supermarket on Diamond Bar Boulevard. The supermarket is among the nearly 150 stores in line to be acquired by the Washington-based Haggen grocery chain.

According to a press release issued by Haggen, the conversion of the stores to the Haggen banner will take place during the first half of 2015.

Founded in 1933, Haggen operates as a full-line grocery store with deli, meat, bakery, seafood, fresh produce departments, and shelves stocked with traditional products as well as an assortment of organic, gluten-free and specialty items.



## A Reminder to Pick Up After Pets

Pet waste left on sidewalks and public right-of-ways is not only unsightly and unneighborly, it is also a health hazard and a violation of the City's Municipal Code.

Listed under section 6.00.090. Animal nuisances; defecation, the Code requires individuals who own or have custody of a dog to immediately collect and properly dispose of any waste it leaves on public property.

In Diamond Bar, the responsibility of enforcing laws involving pets and animals is assigned to the Inland Valley Humane Society (IVHS). To report an incident of a resident not picking up after their pets, call 909.623.9777 between IVHS business hours of 8:00 am to 5:30 pm, Monday through Saturday. You will need to provide as much information as possible including the address of the offender, a description of the animal, and the location and time when the offense took place.

If you or someone you know regularly forgets to pack a bag for their dog walks, call the City's Public Information Division at 909.839.7056 to request a free pet waste bag dispenser that clips onto leashes, collars or key rings. Limited quantities available.

**Can my children play together on the same team?**




