



City Website Redesign

As part of the revamp, the look and feel of the City website will go from soft and muted to modern and bolder

Aimed at strengthening its online presence, the City is preparing to roll out a redesigned website enriched with new and updated features that will improve its accessibility, adaptability and functionality.

Located at diamondbarca.gov, the City website acts as an important communication tool – second only to City Hall – to maintain government transparency and keep Diamond Bar residents, business owners and the other interested individuals informed about new and ongoing City operations, adopted policies and fiscal management actions. It also makes it easy and convenient to access a variety of City services and resources that include live and archived streams of City Council meetings; electronic copies of the City's budget; financial reports and newsletters; service requests; and the Diamond Bar Municipal Code in a searchable database format. Applying for City jobs, requesting City services, registering for recreation classes, and locating general parcel information may also be done through the City website.



Among the improvements this latest website revamp will bring is a font-size-adjusting tool and text-to-speech technology to make navigation easier for individuals with visual impairments, as well as responsive design elements that will prompt the website to automatically adapt to fit any size screen – smartphone, tablet or PC.

Another feature that will result from the new design will improve emergency communications by giving City staff the ability to deploy an attention-grabbing banner across the top of all City webpages with information about an impending or in-progress emergency.

As the main landing page, extra focus was placed on the website homepage to enhance its navigation structure, double the number of quick links to the most popular web pages and sections, and highlight videos and other multimedia content.

Lawn Mower Exchange

If you are thinking about replacing your operable but old gasoline-powered lawn mower, you may want to take advantage of a program sponsored by the South Coast Air Quality Management District (AQMD).

Aimed at reducing smog-forming pollutants caused by gasoline mowers, the AQMD's annual Lawn Mower Exchange Program offers individuals an opportunity to purchase new electric cordless lawn mower at a discounted price.

The program's 2015 cycle opened last month, with registrations processed on a first-come, first-serve basis either by going online to www.aqmd.gov or by calling the toll-free number 888.425.6247. To qualify for the trade-in, gasoline mowers must be in working condition.



Click It Or Ticket

Motorists, here's a reminder that the Diamond Bar-Walnut Sheriff's Station is this month stepping up seatbelt enforcement as part of the national 2015 Click It or Ticket mobilization.

The mobilization, which runs from May 18th through the 31st, is a high-visibility enforcement effort created by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) to crack down on seatbelt violators.

According to NHTSA statistics, nearly half of the motor vehicle occupants who died in crashes in 2013 were unrestrained. Of the 638 children age 12 and younger involved in fatal motor vehicle accidents in 2013, more than a third were unrestrained.

NHTSA reports also indicate that more traffic vehicle deaths occur during the nighttime hours of 6:00 pm and 6:00 am, and that more than half of the passenger occupants killed were not wearing their seatbelts. As a result, nighttime enforcement will continue to be a priority in this year's mobilization.

Under current State law, drivers are responsible for seat belt compliance for all passengers. If the seat belt violator is over 16 years of age, both the driver and the passenger can be cited separately. Offenses may also result in points to the violator's driving record, which could raise insurance rates.




