



# Earth Day Celebration

If you have piles of confidential documents to shred or obsolete electronics to discard, the City's upcoming Earth Day Celebration is just the ticket to take care of both needs at once.

Scheduled to take place on Saturday, April 23 from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. at the SCAQMD parking lot, this second annual Earth Day event features a number of activities, exhibits and educational opportunities centered around environmental conservation.

In addition to paper shredding and electronic waste collection, the event also includes textile recycling, an electronic vehicle display, various information and giveaway booths, children's activities, and free mulch distribution.

Also, for those interested in learning about backyard and worm composting, water-wise gardening and grass-cycling, a Smart Gardening Workshop will be held from 9:30 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. Pre-registration is required to attend the workshop, and can be made by emailing name, address and phone number to [greenDB@diamondbarca.gov](mailto:greenDB@diamondbarca.gov).

# Free Recycling Containers for Businesses

Here is some good news for small shop owners or restaurateurs looking to promote and increase recycling at their place of business.

As part of a grant-funded pilot project to increase the recycling of beverage containers, the City is currently offering free recycling bins to qualifying businesses.

To be eligible for the beverage recycling bins, businesses must submit an application including a recycling plan; bins are available in three capacities — 7, 23 and 50-gallon.

Up to 10 bins of various sizes may be requested to start a program. Clear and colored glass bottles, plastic bottles, as well as tin and aluminum cans are accepted in the bins.

Recycling bins are available on a first-requested, first-fulfilled basis. To obtain the application form, visit [www.diamondbarca.gov/greenDB](http://www.diamondbarca.gov/greenDB) or visit Diamond Bar City Hall, located at 21810 Copley Drive.

This beverage container recycling program is funded through a grant from the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle). # Commercial Leaf Blower Exchange Program



Commercial landscapers and gardeners operating within the South Coast Air Basin are reminded that they have the opportunity to exchange noisy, high-polluting backpack leaf blowers for new backpack blowers that have significantly reduced emission

and noise levels, thanks to a special program sponsored annually by the South Coast Air Quality Management District (AQMD).

This year's Leaf Blower Exchange Program offers three STIHL models at a reduced rate in exchange for the trade-in of a used backpack blower: the BR500 and BGA85 are available for \$200 while the BGA100 cost \$600. The BGA85 and BGA100 models are both battery-electric.

Old leaf blowers that are retired through this program are scrapped and recycled. South Coast Air Basin includes all of Orange County and the non-desert regions of Los Angeles County, Riverside County, and San Bernardino County.

The Leaf Blower Exchange is not open to the public and participation requires advanced registration by contacting the AQMD at 888.425.6247.

# Free Replacement of Worn Bins

Waste Management customers with cracked or broken trash, recycling, or green waste bins are eligible for a free placement. A simple phone call to 800.266.7551 will get your old bin switched out with a new container during your next scheduled collection day. There is no charge to exchange dilapidated bins; however there is a \$50 charge to replace lost or stolen bins.

# Volunteer Summer Program

Are you between the ages of 13 and 15 and looking for a fun way to earn community service hours while gaining job skills in the City recreation services field? The City is currently seeking interested teens to be part of its 2016 Summer Volunteer Program.

To be eligible to participate, you must be available to work starting May 16 and until August 12 for a minimum of 5 to a maximum of 20 hours per week. Hours are mutually arranged between the Volunteer program coordinator and the participant.

Volunteers help with popular City programs such as Summer Day Camp, Youth Baseball and Tiny Tots, and also assist with the City's popular Concerts and Movies in the Park series.

The last day to apply to be considered for the 2016 Volunteer Program is Thursday, April 14. Only online applications submitted through the NeoGov system, available through the City website at [www.DiamondBarCa.gov/employment](http://www.DiamondBarCa.gov/employment) will be considered. No paper applications or emailed resumes will be accepted.

# Alex Morgan: Hometown Hero – World Champion



In recognition for her achievements, both as a professional soccer player and published author, Ms. Morgan became the first individual to be awarded a Key to the City, the highest level of recognition and honor bestowed by the Diamond Bar City Council.

The excitement was palpable as hundreds of soccer enthusiasts gathered close to congratulate professional soccer player and former Diamond Bar resident, Alex Morgan, at a special celebration held in her honor on Sunday, January 24 from 10:00 a.m. to noon at Pantera Park.

Ms. Morgan, who graduated from Diamond Bar High School in 2007, earned a spot on the United States U-20 women's national soccer team at age 17, and joined the U.S. women's national team in 2011 after a successful academic and athletic career at UC Berkeley. She secured her first Olympic gold medal at the 2012 London Games and was a leader on the 2015 team that won the FIFA Women's World Cup.

While only 26 years of age, Ms. Morgan's career has been marked by numerous successes, including being named 2012 U.S. Soccer Female Athlete of the Year, becoming one of the first women to appear on an Electronic Arts' Sports FIFA cover in 2015, and making the Forbes Under 30 list for sports figures also in 2015. Ms. Morgan is also the author of a bestselling middle-grade book series "The Kicks" and last year, published her first memoir "Breakway: Beyond the Goal."

The 2016 Alex Morgan Celebration was organized and hosted by the City, and admission was free and open to the public. In addition to featuring a variety of soccer-themed activities and giveaways, the event included presentations by the Diamond Bar City Council, Walnut Valley Unified School District, Diamond Bar High School, Diamond Bar AYSO, and a number of local elected officials.

Also as part of the festivities, all event-goers age 3 to 17 were entered into a drawing for an opportunity to spend time with Ms. Morgan in a private meet-and-greet session. The 13 winners chosen (in honor of her jersey number 13) were granted brief one-on-one time with Ms. Morgan at the closing of the event, as well as a complimentary autographed copy of her memoir.

Smart & Final Extra! is to be larger than traditional Smart & Final warehouse stores with an expanded selection of grocery products in both bulk and standard sizes.


Once open, store hours will be 6:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m., Monday through Sunday.

**A signed waiver of liability and emergency information card must be signed at the time of registration.** Children must meet the age requirement, be potty-trained and wear regular underwear (not pull-ups) by the first day of the session. A birth certificate may be required. Please read the parent handbook for other class requirements.

### Payment Options:

Payments may be made in full or in two equal installments. If paying in two installments, the first payment is due at the time of registration and the second half is due no later than the fourth week of the session. ## FAQs

### Can my children play together on the same team?

Siblings who live in the same household and play in the same age division will always be placed on the same team. Children are allowed to "play-up" one division (play in a division above their age group), however they are not allowed to play-down.






