## Diamond Bar To Start Its General Plan Update



City officials are embarking on what is anticipated to be a three-year process to comprehensively update the Diamond Bar General Plan, a guiding tool for future land use planning activities. California state law requires every city to prepare and adopt a General Plan, soon after incorporation, and to retain its relevance through periodic updates. While General Plans do not have a definite shelf life, a 20- to 25-year cycle is the accepted norm. Diamond Bar's original General Plan was adopted in 1995.

In keeping with the law, the city's General Plan will address the seven state-mandated areas of land use, circulation, housing, open space, conservation, noise, and safety. Additionally, the Diamond Bar General Plan Update will also cover economic development, community character and placemaking, and health and sustainability.

Because of its comprehensive and long-range nature, it is anticipated that the General Plan Update will be completed sometime in spring 2019. Throughout the entire preparation and adoption process, City officials will make regular communication, public outreach and community participation a priority.

A key communication piece will be a dedicated website with more detailed information about the Diamond Bar General Plan and the update process. The site is currently being developed and upon going live, will serve as a convenient way to stay informed about the project, access related studies and presentations, and find out about opportunities and ways to get involved.

## New Committee To Be Created For General Plan Update

The initial phase of the General Plan Update calls for the Diamond Bar City Council to form a volunteer ad hoc advisory committee, known as the General Plan Advisory Committee or GPAC.

This council-appointed citizen committee will be responsible for making recommendations to the Planning Commission and City Council on a variety of uses related to the update of the city's General Plan. Serving on this committee is a three-year commitment that requires participation in regular meetings and activities throughout the General Plan Update process.

Every city and county in California is required to develop and periodically update a General Plan, and use it to guide decision-making on a variety of matters, including land development, capital improvements, and resource conservation.

Council's goal for the Diamond Bar GPAC is that its members be diverse in age, gender, background, experience and interests, but that they share the common, community-wide, long-term vision and perspective to city growth and development over the next 20 to 25 years.

There are a total of 15 openings on the GPAC. Anyone interested in being considered for a spot on the committee is encouraged to complete an application and submit it to City Hall by the Thursday, September 15 deadline.

## Free Cert Training Opportunity

Come away with essential basic disaster preparedness and response skills

Los Angeles County Fire Department is currently taking registrations for its upcoming Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training, which will be held at the South Coast Air Quality District (AQMD) over three consecutive Saturdays, starting on October 1.


CERT is a FEMA-approved, 21-hour training taught by firefighters and aimed at providing instruction on how to care for yourself, your family and your neighbors during a disaster.

In addition to learning about the various types of hazards that may impact this immediate area, CERT trainees learn light search and rescue, fire safety, team organization, and disaster medical operations. Time is also spent covering terrorism, the disaster and post-disaster emotional environment, the phases of a crisis, and helpful ways to reduce the effects of stress and stabilize survivors.

There is no cost to participate, however participants must be at least 18 years of age and available to complete all three sessions – 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on Saturdays, October 1, 8 and 15 – in order to receive a certificate of completion.

## Improve Your Emergency Readiness



A recent Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) survey found that nearly 60 percent of American adults have not practiced what to do in a disaster by participating in a disaster drill or preparedness exercise at work, school, or home in the past year.

Further, less than half of these adults have developed an emergency plan and discussed it with their household.

With September being National Preparedness Month, the City encourages residents and businesses to make it a priority to increase their preparedness by taking the following steps: **STAY INFORMED:** Sign up to be alerted via text, email, or recorded message of impending or in-progress emergency situations affecting Diamond Bar, by visiting [www.diamondbarca.gov/emergencyalerts](http://www.diamondbarca.gov/emergencyalerts).

**MAKE A PLAN:** Develop an emergency communication plan for your family. This will help you be in touch if a disaster strikes and family members are in different locations. Visit [www.ready.gov/make-a-plan](http://www.ready.gov/make-a-plan) for tips and templates to make your customized plan.

**GATHER SUPPLIES:** Make sure you have 72 hours-worth of emergency supplies readily available in accessible locations at home, at work, and in your vehicles. These include food, water, portable radios, first aid kits, cash, medications, important documents and other special need items for the children, seniors, and pets in your family. You can find recommendations on what to include in your emergency supply kit online at [www.ready.gov/kit](http://www.ready.gov/kit).

**HAZARD-PROOF YOUR HOME:** Inspect your home for potential hazards and identify and secure furniture or items that may break, fall or obstruct an exit during an emergency, such as mirrors, televisions, computers, bookcases, and water heaters.

## Back To School Safety Reminders

With the recent start of a new academic year bringing an increased risk for transportation-related injuries and fatalities, the safety of students is high on the priority list of City officials and law enforcement personnel.

If you are responsible for dropping off or picking up a student, or if your daily commute takes you through a school zone, the City and the Diamond Bar-Walnut Sheriff's Station urge you to familiarize yourself and your school-age family members with important traffic safety laws and practices that include the following:

### Drivers

- ◆ Set a good example by always buckling up and ensuring your passengers do the same, never using your cell phone while driving, and obeying all traffic laws and speed limits.
- ◆ Lower your speed and remain alert for pedestrians – 25 mph is the maximum speed in and around school zones when children are present.
- ◆ Watch for and yield to pedestrians in crosswalks and at all intersections – they have the right-of-way at these locations.
- ◆ If a vehicle stops in front of you, slow down and stop. Do not try to go around – it may have stopped for pedestrians.
- ◆ Never pass a school bus while it is stopped with flashing lights and/or stop sign extended – children are either entering or exiting. Failure to yield is a moving violation and subject to citation.
- ◆ Know and follow the specific drop-off and pick-up procedures established by your student's school.

### Pedestrians

- ◆ Cross the street only at signalized or marked crosswalks, and always look left, right, and then left again, to check for traffic in all directions before stepping off the curb. Keep looking for cars as you cross the street.
- ◆ Always make eye contact with drivers to make sure they can see you before crossing in front of them.
- ◆ Eliminate opportunities for distraction such as the use of cell phone, hand-held games, or music devices.
- ◆ Watch for cars backing out of parking spaces, or entering or exiting driveways – and, never dart out in front of a parked car.

As an added safety measure for both pedestrians and drivers, deputies from the Diamond Bar/Walnut Sheriff's Station will conduct enhanced patrols at school zones and key city intersections to enforce traffic laws, including speeding, cell phone use, illegal parking, school bus passing, jaywalking, and non-seatbelt use.

## New Public Safety Meeting Series

This fall, the City will join forces with the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department and the Los Angeles County Fire Department to launch a new series of community meetings titled "Let's Talk Public Safety."

This series will be open to the public and meetings will be held once every other month in various locations throughout the city, with the first taking place in October. Topics scheduled to be covered as part of the series includes personal safety, property protection, emergency and disaster preparedness, crime trends and prevention strategies, and other public safety-related issues. Refreshments and giveaways will be available to meeting attendees.

## Discounts And Special Services For Qualifying WM Customers

If you are a Waste Management customer who has is at least 60 years of age or has a disability, you may be eligible to receive a discount on the standard residential waste bill, as well as help rolling out your carts to get serviced on collection day if you are physically unable to do so.

In order to be eligible, the Waste Management account must be in your name and you must live at the address where the rate discount or free "backyard garbage service" is requested. A copy of your California ID, utility bill, and DMV disability placard or physician's note may also be required.


