Diamond Bar General Plan Update 2040

The Diamond Bar General Update has been a regular topic in this newsletter for the past several issues – and for good reason.

Diamond Bar's existing General Plan was adopted in 1995, and has since served as the basis for land use decision-making used by the Planning Commission and the City Council.

This Update will be the first comprehensive review the Plan receives, and the first time Diamond Bar's existing conditions and potential challenges and opportunities are studied not only to bring policies up to date, but to position the city for the next 20 years.

While still in its early stages, this is the best time for residents to get involved and share their views, values and priorities on how the city's future growth should be managed, how public spaces should look and function, and how the housing, transportation, and economic needs current and future residents be addressed.

It is anticipated that the City will have comprehensively updated its General Plan and prepared an accompanying Environmental Impact Report by late 2019.

Dedicated General Plan Update Website

If you have not already visited the dedicated General Plan Update Website found at www.DiamondBarGP.com, you are encouraged to do so. Housed in this website is extensive information about the General Plan Update process and progress to date, as well as the various ways and opportunities to get involved and provide input. There is also a library section that currently contains a copy of the 1995 Diamond Bar General Plan, and will be supplemented with meeting presentations, studies and reports as they become available.

There is Still Time to Take the First Survey

One of the first reports the General Plan Update consultant team, in coordination with the City, will be preparing is an assessment of existing conditions, trends and opportunities.

As part of its information gathering activities, the team created a 16-question survey to get the community's input with regard to local housing, shopping, entertainment, recreation, transportation and open space.

City Recognized for Excellence in Information Technology Practices

The City's Information Systems (IS) Department has once again been recognized with an Excellence in Information Technology Practices Award by the Municipal Information Systems Association of California.

This year marks the tenth consecutive year, the City's IS Department has earned this designation, which is the highest level of achievement attainable by a municipality for its technology practices.

Criteria for this award includes sound budgeting and strategic planning, customer support and satisfaction, internet policies, excellence in project management and application development, disaster preparation and recovery, and strong network security.

As part of its responsibilities, the IS Department manages the City's servers and maintains maximum amount of uptime to ensure residents and businesses have reliable, continuous access to the City website and that online credit card transactions such as transit pass sales and recreation class registrations are secure and free of vulnerabilities.

Winter Event Creates Fundraising Opportunities

The City's popular Winter Snow Fest event will again provide local nonprofits a fun way to raise awareness of, and cash for, their causes.

Nonprofits have until Monday, December 12 to apply to work the event as a food vendor, game booth operator or craft area monitor. In exchange for their participation, nonprofits that staff the entertainment areas will receive a portion of proceeds from the wristband and game/craft cards sales; food vendors keep all their profits.

Diamond Bar Welcome's New Sheriff's Captain



Diamond Bar-Walnut Sheriff's Station has a new leader.

Captain Al Reyes, a 32-year veteran of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department, took over command of the station this past October.

Captain Reyes' career with the Sheriff's Department began in 1984. After graduating from the Sheriff's Academy as a Deputy Sheriff, he was assigned to the Hall of Justice Jail as a custody deputy, and then as a patrol deputy at both East Los Angeles and Norwalk Sheriff's Stations.

In November 2000, Captain Reyes was promoted to the rank of sergeant and supervised patrol functions at both Century and Lennox Sheriff's Stations. He was also an Operations Sergeant at Norwalk Sheriff's Station.

Seven years later, Captain Reyes was promoted to Lieutenant and assigned to the Norwalk Sheriff's Station where he worked as a shift watch commander and Service Area Lieutenant for the unincorporated areas of South and West Whittier. He also served as an Operations Lieutenant for Norwalk and Walnut/Diamond Bar Sheriff's Stations. In 2015, Captain Reyes was assigned to Sheriff's Headquarters where he served as the aide to the chief of East Patrol Division.

Captain Reyes has an associate degree in liberal arts from Mt. San Antonio College, and is working toward a bachelor's degree in leadership at Trident University International.

First Phase of Lemon Avenue Interchange Project Underway


Alameda Corridor East (ACE) Construction Authority started work last month on the first phase of a project to construct a new interchange on the 60 freeway at Lemon Avenue.

This new interchange, consisting of eastbound on- and off-ramps and a westbound on-ramp, will address congestion and safety issues both on the freeway and on nearby surface streets.

In addition to providing more direct freeway access to trucks heading into and leaving local industrial areas, the new freeway interchange makes it easier and safer for drivers traveling east on the 60 freeway to merge onto the southbound 57 freeway.

After the new interchange is built, the existing eastbound off- and on-ramps at Brea Canyon Road will be eliminated, which will help reduce the traffic bottleneck currently experienced along Golden Springs Drive between the existing eastbound ramps and Brea Canyon Road.

The first phase of work began on November 14 and is expected to take 12 months, with a final project completion target date in late May 2018.



Construction activities during the first phase include street widening, removal of center medians and storm drain improvements along portions of Lemon Avenue and Golden Springs Drive. They will require the temporary and intermittent closure of traffic lanes within the work zone, however, at least one traffic lane in each direction will remain open at all times.




Free Cab Rides to Diamond Bar Shopping Centers

Holiday shopping in town? Leave your car at home and catch a free cab ride to and from a Diamond Bar shopping center as part of the City's annual Holiday Diamond Ride program.

Free cab rides will be offered until January 1, 2017, and can be booked by calling 800.578.6555. The annual Holiday Diamond Ride program is aimed at supporting local businesses and keeping tax dollars in town. To use this program, you must be at least 18 years of age or accompanied by an adult. Proof of Diamond Bar residency (photo ID or utility bill showing name and address) may be required.

Free Sand and Sandbags

During the rainy weather season, most County of Los Angeles fire stations double as free self-serve sandbag stations. If your home is prone to flooding when it rains, stop by local Station 119 (20480 Pathfinder Rd, 909.598.4290.) or 121 (346 Armitos Rd, 909.396.0165) to pick up free sand and sandbags, while supplies last. Youth Basketball Coaches Needed

Recycle Your Real Holiday Tree

Waste Management will again offer free collection and recycling of real holiday trees up to 14 days after December 25. To have your tree picked up, simply leave it on the curb next to your cars on your scheduled collection day. Trees should not more than 6 feet in length; if necessary, cut into sections. They should also be without stands, lights or decorations. Flocked trees will be accepted but cannot be recycled. For more information, call 800.266.7551.

Temporary Weekly Street Sweeping

Residents are reminded that during the months of December and January, city streets are swept weekly instead of every other week to manage the increase of leaves and other wind-blown debris.

Increasing street sweeping frequency during the last and first months of the year also helps reduce the potential for flooding to occur as a result of clogged storm drains.

To ensure the effectiveness of the City's street sweeping program, residents are asked to do their part by remembering to keep their vehicles off streets that are scheduled for sweeping. The day and hours of parking restrictions are in effect according to posted signage on each individual street.



End-of-the-Year Extra Trash Pickup

From gift wrap to disposable dinnerware, the holiday season can sometimes produce more waste than usual. If you are a Waste Management customer, you can take advantage of its free End-of-the-Year collection service to get rid of the excess waste.

For two weeks beginning December 26, Waste Management will be accepting requests for pickups of additional refuse from customers who call 800.266.7551 at least 24 hours before their regularly scheduled collection days.

Please note that material is limited to household waste that belongs but does not fit inside the regular trash bin. Other waste such as bulky items, hazardous materials and electronics are not eligible for pickup as part of this special service.
